



The harmonic language of today's anthem by Michael John Trotta portrays a feeling of mystery and awe. Completely original music is matched with this most familiar text by John Newton (1725-1807) to create an experience that feels both familiar, but simultaneously transports the listener to someplace new. The Chancel Choir will premiere another new choral masterwork by Mr. Trotta in 2020.

11:00am worship, 1st-3rd graders are invited to join a Worship and Wonder leader in the Gallery. Children will return to the Sanctuary following the sermon.

You can find today's scripture reading on page 229 of the New Testament in your pew Bible.

There is space to take notes during the sermon on page 10 of the bulletin.

We welcome Dr. Sallie Pummill-Pollack who will play the 11:00 offertory. Dr. Pollack is the Piano Division Coordinator at the University of Central Oklahoma. She will be playing the first movement of the Beethoven Sonata. Op. 110. The transcendent nature of the later piano sonatas evoke prayer, contemplation, and community. Op. 110 creates a hymnlike atmosphere while exploring a deep and meditative harmonic development.
