The Lord's Supper (also called communion) is a celebration of Christ's love for the world. Christ is the host and invites all to share in this meal. Our communion bread is free of gluten, wheat, dairy, yeast, eggs, soy, nuts, and corn and we also use alcohol-free grape juice.

Today's postlude depicts Genesis 1:3, when God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. It starts with very soft sounds and builds gradually until the final chord ends with full organ, giving the effect of darkness turning into light.
