

Transition by Rev. Larry Thomas, Senior Minister

This is not my farewell article—I will save that for the April issue. Even so, some have asked me to speak to this period of transition

and how it is affecting the congregation and my family. I hope this helps answer some of your questions.

First, you should know that things are well in hand where leadership transition is concerned. The Board of Stewards has assembled a five-member search committee, chaired by Rev. Zena McAdams. Zena retired after thirtyfour years of ministry and also served for seventeen years as Regional and Area Minister in Louisiana, Georgia and Texas and is now a UCC member. The search committee will begin the search for an Interim Senior Minister with guidance from our Interim Regional Minister, Rev. Coretha Loughridge. The Board voted to approve promotion of Rev. Cyndy W. Twedell to Senior Associate Minister. One of the primary reasons I provided as much notice as I did was to provide space and energy for us to navigate this process with

great care and deliberation. We have done so, thus far, and have avoided creating an undue amount of anxiety. This is a visible sign of the health and strength of your leadership and of this congregation.

The Board of Stewards has announced my official departure date of April 10. That will allow me to preach through Easter and participate in post-Easter baptisms. I will also be presiding at a wedding in April. I will remain engaged in the day-to-day operations of the church and will be working with several of the administrative committees to finish up important projects that we had started together. I think you will be pleased with the outcome of this work.

I will be backing off a bit over the course of the next couple of months. This is a strategic move to allow everyone to adjust to new patterns of leadership and new personalities as they arrive and/or assume new positions. Please know that I have been working closely with the Chairperson of the Board of Stewards, Monty Phillips, and the Chairperson of the Personnel Committee, Dr. Cy Rowell, to insure that my plans and actions are

in keeping with theirs. Again, things are working smoothly and according to plan. It is my intent to remain present and available and to continue to serve in the capacity of Senior Minister until otherwise notified.

Some of you have asked specifically about my future plans; this is what I can share with you at this point. My family and I will be moving to Centralia, Missouri, and I will be serving two voked congregations on a part-time basis; First Christian Church, Madison (my home church) and Holliday Christian Church. The congregations are twenty-miles north of Centralia. I will be pursuing some other vocational interests in hopes of keeping Lucas' tuition paid and the lights on in the Thomas home. I am also hoping to lead some seminars related to my interests as well as do some writing in the same vein.

Last but not least, I hope to slow down, a bit, and spend some time with my family. I would be remiss if I did not say that I am also looking forward to some quiet time in the great outdoors.


Easter Brunch, Easter Sunday





Chancel Choir Music Library Addition

The Chancel Choir music library just received a vital and much needed operational upgrade with the installation of its new music folder cabinet. The cabinet houses both the rehearsal and performance folders that hold the weekly sheet music changes for the choir's rehearsals and worship service performances, year round. The requirement for a new cabinet was

made necessary by the choir's fortyyear-old folders needing to be replaced by new, larger folders which would not fit the old folder cabinet, also over forty years old!

With the reality of minimal resources, the Chancel Choir Council contacted the UCC Carpenters team for help. Charles Kendall, J.E. Edwards, John Garnett, Bill Smith and Arthur Townsend constructed the necessary cabinet for only the cost of materials. The wood cabinet had to be specially measured, designed and constructed to accommodate the rather unique space requirements of the 100 active folder slots necessary for the UCC Chancel Choir. The resultant new cabinet is truly excellent workmanship and was even bolted to the wall for safety.

The project was also made successful because of UCC's music staff's wonderful Administrative Assistant, Marsha Hodges. She provided constant support, information and easy library access to our gifted UCC Carpenters throughout the project. Marsha coordinated the complex transitioning from the old system to the new cabinet and folders without interrupting the unforgiving pace of the Chancel Choir's weekly rehearsal and worship performances.

The Chancel Choir and the rest of the UCC congregation owe the UCC Carpenters all our sincerest thanks and kudos for a job well done.
