Dedication of the UCC Peace Pole



Rain didn't dampen the spirit as UCC's Peace Pole was dedicated on Sunday, April 17. We raised our voices in Korean, Arabic, Chinese, Greek, Spanish and English to pray together: May Peace Prevail on Earth.

Peace Poles have come to be recognized as the most prominent international symbol and monument to peace. Peace Poles bear the message, May Peace Prevail on Earth in the languages of the world. The Peace Pole in UCC's Courtyard holds eight languages: English, Cherokee, Chinese (Mandarin), Swahili, Spanish, Hebrew, Hindi and Arabic.

More than 200,000 Peace Poles are estimated to have been dedicated in nearly every country on Earth. Planting a Peace Pole is a way of bringing people together to inspire, awaken and uplift the human consciousness the world over. And for those of us who have dedicated ourselves to following the Prince of Peace, the Peace Pole is a place of prayer and commitment to the ways of healing, hope, reconciliation and peace.

It is fitting that Elena Huegel, our missionary partner, was with us for the dedication. It was with Elena at the Shalom Center in Chile that a UCC delegation there helped construct, plant and dedicate a peace pole (the first in Chile) at Centro Shalom, the camp set in the breathtaking foothills of the Andes Mountains. That day in 2008 we gathered around the pole and prayed in French Creole, Spanish, Guarani and English.

In January, our fourth delegation to Chile was part of a Peace Pole dedication in Vichuquen, Chile, with rubble yet to be cleared from the recent earthquake still visible behind it. And again we prayed in the languages of those present.

Peace Poles symbolize the oneness of humanity and our common wish for a world of peace. May our Peace Pole remind us to think, speak and act in the spirit of peace and unity in our diversity. May it stand as a silent visual for peace to prevail on earth.

Update from the Interim Search Committee

University Christian Church is engaged in an important transition. We're doing much more than waiting. Now is the time to engage in significant reflection, visioning and intentionality as we build on the strong foundation left with us by Rev. Thomas' intelligent and impassioned leadership. This time between settled senior ministers provides an opportunity for us to come to terms with our identity, reaffirm our vision and direction for ministry and cultivate a commitment to a new future with new leadership.

Taking time to be prayerful and intentional about how to spend this time of transition is the mark of a healthy church and calling an Interim Minister is an important step in this process.

At its April 19 meeting, the Board of Stewards heard a report from the Interim Search Committee. Not at liberty to tell the name of the candidate, the Committee told the BOS they had found the right person, a highly respected, capable minister whose call is intentional interim ministry. Pending final negotiations, the

candidate would begin the first of August. The Committee and the BOS are confident he is worth waiting for. More information will be presented at the May BOS meeting and at the May Assembly Meeting. A transition team will be created soon and the ministerial staff, with the support of the BOS and Elders, is confident they can provide the leadership needed until then.

Canned Food Challenge–How High "Can" We Go?



South Central Alliance of Churches, the local outreach arm of UCC, is grateful to receive UCC's

canned good offering each May. SCAC is made up of fourteen churches and has been in operation since 1988, serving our neighbors in zip codes 76104, 76109 and 76110. It provides both case management and emergency assistance which might include food, rental assistance, utility assistance, bus tokens, gas vouchers, toiletries and baby items.

The SCAC emergency food pantry is

sourced entirely by donations from member churches and the community. This year, UCC has a goal of collecting and stacking 1,000 canned goods! How high can we go?

We invite you to drop-off nonperishable food items in the collection bin by the Reception Desk. Suggested items include: canned meats and fish, fruit, vegetables and soup, powdered and evaporated milk, baby formula, pudding or custard, peanut butter, dried beans, macaroni and cheese, hamburger helper, tuna helper, rice and pasta.

Monetary donations are also welcomed Make checks made payable to UCC, note as a donation for SCAC and place in the collection plate or leave with the receptionist. Or donate onlinedesignate payment to "May Canned Food Challenge."





A foot injury nearly cost Brian his life. He was walking to the bus stop after a day's


work and fell, cutting his foot. Because Brian was homeless, his problem became life threatening. Luckily, he survived thanks to the support of *Room in the Inn*. Brian was among the RITI guests at a Fort Worth church. He was limping badly. His foot was not healing and it hurt. That worried another guest who persuaded Brian to take off his shoe and check the wound. It was clear that this was a medical emergency.

An RITI volunteer called 911. Another sat with Brian offering encouragement

while waiting for the ambulance. Doctors saved Brian's life, but they could not save his foot. Through it all, a steady stream of visitors from RITI churches came to the hospital to show support. Kristy Hroch, DRC director of client services, worked hard to secure temporary shelter, a prosthesis and finally a permanent home for Brian.

This story is just one of many found on the DRC website. Here at UCC, we impact the lives of our RITI guests in many ways. When asked to do so, we pray with and for them. We offer a sympathetic ear as they tell us of their frustrations and tragedies. We encourage them as they seek jobs and housing, and celebrate with them when their search is fruitful.

We truly care for our guests and want much more for them than the meal and bed that we provide. As often as possible, a nurse is here from 5-5:30 p.m. to take blood pressure, answer guest's questions and advise them to seek care when necessary. One of our nurses found that a guest had dangerously high blood pressure and was able to convince him to go to the clinic.


