



Words from our Senior Minister

There Where are We Going?

There is an old saying that goes like this, "if you don't know where you are going, any road will get you there."


That is true for traveling. I think it is also true for congregations.

This is an exciting time to be a part of University Christian Church. There is great energy and enthusiasm; attendance is up, and so is giving. But if we don't take some strategic steps to build off the momentum, we'll soon begin to plateau and eventually decline. This is the perfect time for us to carefully and prayerfully discern God's vision for our church in this next season in our life together.

With that in mind, we have entered into a Strategic Discernment Process to help us answer three questions: Where are we? Where are we going? How are we going to get there?

We have begun working with a consultant, Mike Bonem, (www. mikebonem.com). Mike comes highly regarded with an incredible track record of helping congregations create a clear, shared and compelling vision. He helps provide direction for the future and helps create strategic priorities to bring the vision to fruition. Mike is helping lead us in this process. A group of talented and dedicated laypeople are working under Mike's leadership as part of the Strategic Discernment task force to identify and articulate a few strategic priorities, each with their own plans and goals. At the end of this phase, we'll have a clear vision and path forward. Once this process is complete, Mike will be available to help us as we move into the next phase, to insure we are successful in our implementation efforts.

For the last several months, a task force has been working diligently to articulate a clear, concise vision statement, mission statement and our core values. The clergy staff, the Board of Stewards and the Assembly have all seen that work and have unanimously and enthusiastically approved it. We will be rolling it out to the congregation later this month. I'll also begin a new sermon series that will walk us through these statements and our core values later this month. Expect to receive a letter from Lindsay Klatzkin and I that will speak more to the process and what it means for us as a community of faith.



I'm very excited about what it says about who we are and who we believe God is calling us to be.

I'm also incredibly excited about the upcoming changes to our Children's Ministry. As you'll read on the next page, a wonderful, talented group of an amazing group of gifted teachers, marketing experts and community leaders drawn from our congregation have been working diligently to reboot our ministry with our children—what they've come up with will blow you away! I can't wait for you to see it.

Studies show that children often bring their parents to church. If the kids aren't engaged and excited, their parents won't be either. Having a strong, vital ministry for our children is imperative for a growing church. But even more importantly, we owe it to our children to teach them what it means to be a child of God; to give them a strong foundation of faith that will help them navigate through life.

As I said, this is an exciting time to be a part of University Christian Church. I am excited about this next season and truly believe that God is calling us to do incredible things together—we are taking important steps to live into that calling! For now, I invite you to be in prayer for our beloved church as we prayerfully listen and discern where God is calling us to go and be.

Exciting Changes for Children's Ministry





As summer nears its end and children begin returning to school, we gear up to have our little ones back for Sunday programming. Children's Ministry is an initial and essential step in development of sticky faith. As we look to continue to build the congregation, families with young children are of driving importance. That is why, with great excitement, we welcome children on August 18 for our Back to Church Sunday to new programming...Discovery.

Expect to see updated and new elements from the retirement of Journey Land and launch of Discovery with five main features:

- The inclusion of Kindergarteners in the new children's Sunday School program.
- On Sundays, all children from Kindergarten to grade 5 will begin together in a large, interactive session in Discovery Headquarters (Room 211), led by a staffed Young Life Leader. From this point, children will be led into smaller sessions with age appropriate content.
- The curriculum, Dig In, will engage the children by providing creative, multisensory teachings, immersing them in deep Bible learning, helping them to know Jesus personally and grow in relationship with him.
- Discovery programming will mirror that of a school year with fall and spring semesters. Parents will be able to drop children off at 9:45am to allow enough time to get to their own Sunday School class. Discovery will include a 10:00am-12:00pm time slot during Sunday mornings.
- After 20 years of much love, the rooms have received a fresh look.

We are thankful to those that volunteered their time over the summer to make these changes a reality. I am happy to announce our children will be led on Sunday's by six dedicated volunteers, Lauren Muckleroy, Kelly Kruse, Ali Briseno, Julie Vitek, Beth Zemkoski, and Stephanie Stoner. These ladies look forward to meeting and introducing themselves to each child during the Discovery Open House at 10:00am on August 11.

This fall semester promises to be a fun filled, engaging experience for the children of UCC.




