

Words from our Senior Minister

This Must Be the Place

We have reached the end of a very interesting decade. A businessman-turned-reality-TV-host is the leader of the free world. The Chicago Cubs won the world series. A social network which you once used to look at the photos of your cousin's kids ended up tipping the election and has altered the way in which people connect with one another. We communicate extensively with emojis, and though people are constantly looking at their phones, little of that time is spent truly connecting with others.

It's all enough to leave you scratching your head and feeling somewhat... unrooted.


As we barrel into a new decade, I've been examining the idea of what a home truly means. Is home the place where you grow up? Where you live now? The community which shaped you the most? And maybe your answer to these questions is all the same place. Or, maybe it is more complicated.

For me, the '10s were momentous: I got married, thus doubling the number of my children. I left the church I was raised in and landed my dream job (this one!) and I moved to Texas.

Yet, there is something about adulthood—even in my 50's, with a family to feed, a church to lead and bills to pay—which feels somewhat transient. Maybe that is because in the last ten years we've purchased three houses and moved several times.

I have been amazed during my time here in Fort Worth by how many of you have lived here your entire lives. You went to Alice B. Carlson, McClean, and Paschal; you grew up, got baptized and married at UCC, and have never left Cowtown. So, for a lot of you, the answer to the question: "Where is home?" may be simple.

But what about people who aren't from here?
People who are looking to be included and feel connected, but find it difficult to break into this strong, tight-knit community; this "great big small town?"



There is a line from a Talking Heads song that says, "Home, it's where I want to be / But I guess I'm already there." I guess what I've come to realize is this: Your home is where your people are. They might be your parents and siblings. Your friends. Your spouse. Your children. Your church.

Kelli and I are so thankful for the way you have welcomed our family. We love this congregation, this city and are proud to call this home. Thank you for being our people.

I see wonderful things ahead for this congregation in the next decade. And there is no place I'd rather be, nothing I'd rather be doing, no one I'd rather being doing it with, than what we are all doing here together.
