



Words from our Senior Minister

We Pray for Children

It is that time of year again. With squeaky new shoes and a backpack full of supplies, children of all ages drudge back to class for another year of book reports and pop quizzes.

I would invite and encourage you to pause, for just a moment, and say a prayer for all those who are going back to school this month; for those who are sending their kids off to school-whether it's for kindergarten or off to college; and for the teachers who have one of the most important and least appreciated jobs in our society.

I share with you this prayer, written by Ina Hughes, simply entitled, We Pray for Children

We Pray for Children-who sneak popsicles before supper,

who erase holes in math workbooks.

who can never find their shoes.

And we pray for those

who don't bound down the street in a new pair of sneakers.

who are born in places where we wouldn't be caught dead,

who never go to the circus.

who live in an X-rated world.

We pray for children

who bring us sticky kisses and fistfuls of dandelions,

who hug us in a hurry and forget their lunch money.

And we pray for those

who never get dessert,

who have no safe blanket to drag behind them,

who watch their parents watch them die,

We pray for children

who spend all their allowance before Tuesday,

who throw tantrums in the grocery store and pick at their food, who like ghost stories,


who shove dirty clothes under the bed,


